## Prof. Dr. h.c. Thomas C. Mettenleiter Friedrich-Loeffler-Institut

Thomas C. Mettenleiter was born in 1957 in Göppingen, Germany. He studied biology at the University of Tübingen, Germany, and has a doctorate degree in natural sciences. In addition, he holds an honorary veterinary doctorate of the University of Veterinary Medicine Hanover.

Since 1997, Thomas C. Mettenleiter is President of the Friedrich-Loeffler-Institut, Federal Research Institute for Animal Health, Germany. Simultaneously, he has been director of the FLI's Institute of Molecular Virology and Cell Biology (IMVZ) since 1994.

Thomas C. Mettenleiter is a molecular virologist specializing in herpesviruses of animals, in particular cattle, pigs, poultry and fish, and has thirty years' experience in the field of animal health. He joined the Federal Research Centre for Virus Diseases of Animals (now Friedrich-Loeffler-Institut) in 1982. Besides his focus on animal herpesviruses he is also involved in research into the molecular biology of other animal viruses including avian influenza viruses, rabies virus and Newcastle Disease virus. He (co)authored more than 375 peer-reviewed publications and several books, and serves as serial editor of Advances in Virus Research, the oldest review series in virology.

Thomas C. Mettenleiter also is an adjunct professor at the University of Greifswald, Germany, and a member of the German Academy of Science Leopoldina. Further memberships include the Academy of Sciences in Hamburg, the Polish Academy of Sciences and the Royal Academy of Medicine of Belgium. He is Board Member of the European Society for Veterinary Virology and of the European Society for Virology.
